History

Kailali Multiple Campus (KMC) stands as a premier academic institution in the region, dedicated to advancing higher education and supporting the comprehensive development of its students. KMC commits to create an enriching learning atmosphere, encourage critical thinking, and cultivate capable individuals who can make meaningful contributions to society. Forty-three years ago, Kailali District lacked any institutions of higher education. The absence of post-SLC educational opportunities and the growing social demand created a pressing need for a campus in the district. Before the establishment of KMC, most students from the region had to travel to Kathmandu or India to continue their studies after SLC. In response, the people of Kailali took the initiative to establish a campus. This led to the founding of Kailali Commerce Campus in 1980, which was later renamed Kailali Multiple Campus (KMC). The financial and other resources necessary for establishing the campus were gathered through the dedicated efforts and sacrifices of the local community. People from all walks of life generously contributed to the campus fund. In its early days, KMC was operated in Panchodaya School, serving fewer than 100 students. In 1983, the campus was relocated to its current location. Currently, KMC is affiliated with Far Western University (FWU) since 2021 and now hosts over 6,000 students. Since its inception, KMC has educated thousands of students who are now contributing to various sectors of society.

KMC has been a trailblazing community-based educational institution in Nepal. Nestled in the scenic and serene eastern part of Dhangadhi Sub-metropolitan City, KMC is now a fully government-aided, not-for-profit campus, established with the sole purpose of providing higher education. KMC has become a hub for excellence in higher education because of its top-notch academic program, ample physical facilities, affordable tuition fee, and convenient location that allows it to serve every district in the Far Western Province.

Vision

Kailali Multiple Campus intends to be a prestigious autonomous academic institution of higher education in Nepal committed to academic excellence by providing access to educational opportunities in different branches of knowledge to the people and continuing efforts envisioning KMC as a center of educational excellence.

Infrastructures and Learning Resources

The physical infrastructure of the campus is expanded into 27 Bighas of land with different buildings, canteen, Science lab, Computer lab, Geography lab, Health and Sport Centre, hostel (under construction), deep tube-well for clean drinking water and 65KV generator for regular power supply. The college has several plans underway for its overall development.

Conference Centre

KMC has a spacious air-conditioned conference hall and a seminar hall with the capacity of more than 100 people. KMC hosts national and international academic conferences in the conference centre.

F.M. Radio

Radio KMC 104.6 MHz's main focus is on broadcasting student-centric community-based programmes. In addition to these features, music and songs are incorporated into the application to make it more engaging. The institution pays close attention to the balance of education, information, and fun in the broadcasting programme.



Research Management Cell (RMC)

Kailali Multiple Campus is effortful to develop the culture of promoting research, consultancy and extension activities to achieve academic excellence. The college has established a research department for conducting research activities. The cell calls for research proposal for

publishing articles in KMC Journal and for doing mini-research projects. It also conducts research oriented workshops and seminars and invites guest lecturers. The college has linkage established for research with Social Inclusion Research Fund (SIRF) and its objective is to generate a vibrant and informed debate on contemporary issues of social exclusion and social inclusion at the regional and local level.

Students Union

Free Student Union is an elected students' representative body in Kailali Multiple Campus. It is primarily responsible for representing students' rights, concerns and welfare. The FSU plays an active role in addressing students-related issues. Along with advocating students' rights and welfare, FSU also organizes extracurricular activities, non-credit course classes, cultural programs, and social awareness programs.



Sports

KMC has various outdoor games like Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton and Indoor games like Chess, Table Tennis and various academic games are available in college. The students regularly participate in such competitions and bring glory to the campus.

Student Support and Guidance Cell

Kailali Multiple Campus, since its establishment, has been supporting to the students for their all-round development. For this purpose, the college has formed a Student Support

and Guidance Cell. As a network of the former students of the college, KMC Alumni has been formed and the association is planning to raise fund and other recourses for the development of the college.

Health Centre

KMC provides First Aid services to the students within college hours. Minor injuries and illness are treated within the premises and in case in major injury students are taken immediately to nearby hospital and informed to their parents. In such cases, students are responsible to bear the medical expenses.

Library

KMC has good collection of various books, Journals, Magazines, Students Project Reports and so on. They offer access to current, global and relevant information in various formats to serve the information needs of the academic fraternity. The library has incorporated books in the field of Science, Politics, Engineering, Humanities, Management and so on. Besides, KMC provides well-equipped reference and study section and e-library.



WiFi Facilities

KMC provides high speed internet access to all the students via free Wi-Fi. The facility can be used for information and research purposes via cell phone or laptops.

Auditorium

KMC also provides large halls for gathering, speech and stages performances. The auditorium has spacious environment, good sound and projection system and well-spaced seating arrangement. Students regularly take part in different activities to enhance their interpersonal skills.

Laboratory

KMC is equipped with a range of modern laboratory equipment, enabling students to effectively apply their theoretical knowledge in practical settings. The campus features specialized laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Computer Science.



Cafeteria

KMC has the provision of canteen and the students can take meal on their self-payment. The canteen serves freshly prepared and well-balanced food to the students and staff. Students are given a choice between vegetarian and non-vegetarian items and can enjoy healthy and nutritious meal.

Beautiful Gardens

As places connected to natural ridge woods, KMC provides recreational and spiritual activities to the community and improve the beauty of the campus.

Hundreds of students use the garden spaces for debates and discussions. The campus garden attracts several bird watchers. In addition, residents from the surrounding areas and the city come to the college for morning and evening walks, thus, the collage garden provides a major public service.



Public Information Cell

The college has established a public information cell. The cell publishes KMC bulletin which contains the information related to the academic activities, administrative activities and financial information (such as annual budget and audited financial report) of the college. The cell collects responses from the readers on the published information.

Scholarships and Medals

KMC provides scholarships/freeships to meritorious and deserving students. KMC also awards two gold medals annually (i) Thek Raj Pant Gold Medal awarded to the student securing highest mark among the campus students (ii) Kamala Devi Pant Gold Medal awarded to the highest scoring girl student of the campus.
